The use of coal as an energy source is a major cause of deforestation resulting in a negative impact on biodiversity

Promoting the use of solar energy or energy-efficient wood stoves is a conservation strategy that seeks to reduce forests logging and promoting healthier ways to cook. This system has many benefits, such as saving money, reducing fuel purchase -such as propane gas, diminishing time spent searching for firewood, and avoiding harmful smoke from traditional coal stoves.
